| Public<br>transport | The Netherlands has a well organised<br>public transport system. This consists<br>mainly of trains, trams, buses and<br>metro. Access is arranged by means of<br>an electronic chipcard (OV-chip).  | http://www.ns.nl/en                  |

| <ul> <li>Herring (raw and salty fish with onions).</li> <li>This is very often a challenge for foreigners! Either you like it or not. The Dutch way of eating this is rather special as well you grab it by its tail, bend your head backwards and bite it piece by piece.</li> <li>These will be served during lunch.</li> <li>Kibbeling (fried fish).</li> </ul> |  |

| This is white fish with a special dip and local spices baked in hot<br>oil.<br>Very popular with children as well!   |  |
| Paling (smoked eel).<br>This is rather expensive fish. The smoking is a special technique<br>and there is even a Dutch competition regarding smoking paling.   |  |
| Mussels.They are a typical local product from the state Zeeland. Cookedin a pan with vegetables and you use the shell of an emptymussel to grab to other mussels. Also very popular in Belgium.Served with French fries and mayonaise.Mayonaise is for the Dutch what ketch-up is for the Americans.   |  |
| Pancakes (pizza size, sweet, spicy,).<br>What should we say about this typical Dutch food<br>After the meeting on Saturday we are going to an old farm,<br>actually the stable, and have pancakes. They serve over 200<br>different flavours and you can also compose your own pancake.<br>Beware of the size!   |  |
| <b>Poffertjes.</b><br>They look like tiny pancakes and served with some butter<br>(melting) and powder sugar. The luxerous version has warm<br>cherries and whipped cream (whipped cream in the Netherlands<br>is with sugar).   |  |
| <b>Stroopwafel.</b><br>This is a worldwide famous cookie! You can get them fresh and warm on markets and some special shops. When you buy a package yourself you can put a stroopwafel for about 20 seconds on top of a cup of hot tea or coffee.  |  |

| <b>Bolus (turt).</b><br>Specialty in the south-west of the Netherlands in the state<br>Zeeland (Sealand).<br>It is cake with cinnamon and sugar.   |  |

| Vlaai (pie).<br>This is a speciality of the south east state Limburg. There are<br>many different types. There are 3 ways of slicing them the<br>south way: 8 pieces. The Dutch way: 10 pieces. The Den Haag<br>(town in the west) way: 12 pieces (which is normally refused).<br>We serve a selection on Saturday morning when you have<br>registered.  |  |
| Oliebol (fried cake, with or without raisins).<br>The tradition is that they will be eaten around 31st of December<br>and New Years Day.<br>However, you can get them at many markets all over the<br>Netherlands all year.  |  |
| Kroket and bitterbal.<br>There are about 10 different types (content is mashed meat or<br>vegetables, etc.) and fried in hot oil. The difference between<br>kroket and bitterbal is in fact onle the shape.<br>Beware: the inside is very hot (temperature) while the outside<br>might already be cooled off!<br>They are normally served with mustard.<br>These will be served on Friday evening during the reception of<br>foreign guests and also during lunch. |  |
| Saté. This is in fact Indonesian (Indonesia was a Dutch colony)<br>and is either grilled pork or chicken meat on a stick with peanut<br>butter sauce. Served with French fries and mayonaise.<br>Mayonaise is for the Dutch what ketch-up is for the Americans.  |  |
| Bossche Bol.<br>There is in fact only one bakkery in 's Hertogenbosch (Den<br>Bosch) were they are made This is bakkery 'Jan de Groot'<br>near the train station.<br>https://www.bosschebollen.nl/<br>It is whipped cream inside special cake covered with chocolate.  |  |
