


Methods



- ☐ PubMed as a search engine to query the MEDLINE
- ☐ A total of **13,320 publications** were identified
- Bibliometric approach
 - academic literature
 - productivity
 - quality ("performance")
 - structural trends of researchers
 - organizations
 - specific academic fields, ...



Annual growth rate: 10.7% (vs 4.5% in biomedicine)



RCT: **7.4%** (1995) **to 20.3%** (2014) (vs **4.5%** growth of RCT in biomedicine) doi:10.1371/journal.pone.0168123.t003





Acupuncture research was conducted in 60 countries

Italy, South Korea, Germany and Australia exhibited higher annual growth rates in recent years.

The number of journals has increased over the years, especially indexed journals and non-English journals



Conclusions

- □ Research in Acupuncture has grown markedly in the past two decades
- ☐ 2-fold higher growth rate than biomedical research overall.
- ✓ Pain: a consistent dominant research focus
- ✓ Other topics gained more attention during this time period.
- These findings provide
- an analysis of strengths and gaps in the current state of acupuncture research,
- for a comprehensive strategy for further advancing the field.
